### Life's Biggest Mistakes

**Luke 12:15-21**

The canvas of the parable of the rich fool is told in light of a dispute between two brothers. Jesus has just taught on the importance of standing for Him, and on our great value to God. Yet, in the midst of this teaching, a man interrupts Jesus to ask that He take his side in a financial dispute. The man, however, wasn't asking Jesus to listen to both sides and make a righteous judgment; he is asking Jesus to take sides with him against his brother. The bottom line, Jesus uses the parable to address the man's covetousness and greed.
