HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

John 13:3 occurs in the setting of the Last Supper, where Jesus washes the feet of the disciples. The aim is to teach them the importance of serving. The act of washing feet was an act performed by a servant of lower-status individuals in ancient times to clean dirt and dust accumulated from walking on dusty roads. Jesus who was the teacher and leader, took on the role of a servant and washed the feet off his disciples to teach them humility or how to put others before you.
